T-LEVELS



Barnet's T Levels

Equivalent to three A Levels and developed in collaboration with employers and businesses, T Levels combine classroom theory, practical learning, and a 45 day industry placement with an employer in order to provide students with practical experience of the work place. A five-day-a-week study programme – 80% of your time will be spent in school/ college and 20% will be on placement.

The content on T Level courses aims to meet the needs of industry and prepare students to be workplace ready, offering the knowledge, skills and experience needed to open the door to highly skilled employment, an apprenticeship or higher-level study.

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Welcome to your Post 16 options in Barnet

When you enter Post 16 education, there are many alternatives to A Levels which offer a more practical route to your chosen career. These routes give you the option to get on the job training, learn while you earn and clear pathways straight to the job of your choice.

BTECs

BTEC stands for the Business and Technology Education Council. BTECs are specialist work-related qualifications that combine practical learning with subject and theory content. BTECs are designed for young people interested in a particular sector or industry but who are not yet sure what job they'd like to do. You could study a BTEC at Level 2 or 3, either alongside academic qualifications or as part of a wider programme (such as an apprenticeship). You can also study a BTEC as a standalone course.

Cambridge Technicals

Cambridge Technicals are vocational qualifications at Level 2 and Level 3 for students aged 16+. They're designed with the workplace in mind and provide a high-quality alternative to A Levels with a great range of subjects to choose from.

Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships allow you to combine work and study by mixing on-the-job training with classroom learning. You'll be employed to do a real job while studying for a formal qualification, usually for one day a either at a college or a training centre. By the end of your apprenticeship, you'll hopefully have gained the skills and knowledge needed to either succeed in your chosen career or progress onto the next apprenticeship level.

City & Guilds

A **City and Guilds** qualification is a technical education option that focuses more on practical work.

T Levels

T Levels are an alternative to A Levels, apprenticeships and other 16 to 19 courses. Equivalent to 3 A Levels, a T Level focuses on students developing the knowledge, attitude and practical skills required to be able to progress into skilled employment, higher study or an apprenticeship. A T Level is constructed of core theory, occupational skills and a 45 day Industry Placement.



Please note that the courses listed in this document are correct at the time of production/publication. Schools and colleges can change their course offer depending on their circumstances.

Careers advice for young people in Barnet Provided by BEETS

Barnet Education, Employment and Training Support

Our service provides careers guidance, information and advice for young people in Barnet after leaving Year 11 until the age of 19 (or 25 for young people with statements/EHCP).

All young people now need to continue in learning at least until their 18th birthday. This is called Raising the Participation Age (RPA)

We can advise you on the following options:

- Remaining in full time education or training in a school, college or with a training provider
- Applying for an Apprenticeship, Traineeship or Supported Internship
- Getting a job, becoming self-employed or a volunteer for more than twenty hours a week, including doing part-time training or education alongside (usually approximately one day a week)

Programmes for young people aged 18-24 who are in Care and Care Leavers

These programs provide valuable support in finding employment, apprenticeships, or training to kickstart your career. You'll be paired with a dedicated Caseworker who will offer one-on-one support with:

- **Creating your CV.**
- **Offering career guidance.**
- **Assisting with job searches.**
- **Completing applications.**
- **Providing interview practice.**

Additionally, you'll have access to a Mentor to boost your confidence and motivation if you feel it's needed.

Your Caseworker or Mentor will continue to offer ongoing support for at least the first six months of any role or course you embark on.

All referrals are made through your Social Worker, Personal Adviser, or Healthcare Provider. The Caseworker will collaborate closely with the Personal Adviser, Social Worker, and Mentor to ensure consistency and avoid redundancy in actions.

T-LEVELS



WELCOME TO THE NEXT LEVEL

An alternative to A Levels, T Levels are high-quality, classroom-based technical programmes which give young people the technical and practical skills needed to be an asset in the workplace. T Levels are a 2 year qualification and give you a head start towards the career you want.

The government developed T Levels to deliver world class technical education and provide you with a new exciting choice after GCSEs.

LEARN YOUR WAY

T Levels involve more classroom study than apprenticeships, which means you can experience an industry while you continue your studies.

Like A Levels, there are no tuition fees to study a T Level if you start before you are 19. Schools and colleges set their own entry requirements, so check their website or contact them direct to find out more.

T LEVEL SUBJECTS

The first T Levels were introduced in September 2020, more T Levels will continue to be rolled out during the next couple of years. There will be more than 20 available covering a range of subjects from digital to health and engineering to science.

GET AHEAD IN YOUR CAREER

T Levels give you the chance to learn what a real career is like while you continue your studies.

Your industry placement will last for at least 45 days – when and how you complete it depends on the T Level, college/school and employer.

INDUSTRY PLACEMENT

This provides you with an invaluable opportunity to put the learning, knowledge and skills developed in school/ college into practice in a real workplace. An Industry Placement will mean you are work ready in your chosen career pathway.

CREATED WITH EMPLOYERS

T Levels have been designed with leading businesses and employers to give you the knowledge and skills you need.

More than 250 businesses – including Fujitsu and Skanska – have been involved so you can be confident your T Level will move you to the next level.

QUALIFICATIONS THAT COUNT

When you pass your T Level, you will get a nationally recognised certificate showing the overall grade you achieved – pass, merit, distinction or distinction*. It will also give details of what you learned on the course to help you move into skilled employment or a higher apprenticeship.

AWARDED UCAS POINTS

Your T Level will be worth UCAS points and will be recognised by universities and other education providers so you can choose to continue studying if you wish.





T-LEVELS

How do T Level grades work?

T Level grades will be given as:

Pass	Merit	Distinction	Distinction*
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T Levels provide several progression options to students, these include skilled employment, an apprenticeship and higher education. To help T Level students get into higher education, UCAS tariff points are allocated to T Levels.

Students must achieve at least a pass in all elements of the qualification to attract UCAS points.

Business

A knowledge of business and business processes are useful for many different job roles, for example, accountancy, banking, sales and customer service. It is also useful if you plan to set up your own business in the future or be self-employed. It teaches you valuable skills such as teamwork, numeracy, management and basic finance.

Types of careers

Marketing Manager

Managing all marketing for the company and activities within the marketing department.

Finance Officer

Financial officers are in charge of overseeing the financial transactions of a company and running the accounts.

Business Development

Business development staff identify sales opportunities, pitch goods or services to new clients and maintain a good relationship with new contacts.

Care/Health and Social Care/Childcare

Studying health studies is useful for anyone wanting a career in the health sector. It will give you the opportunity to learn about healthcare systems and progress to university and study a degree specifically related to health, e.g. radiography, midwifery, nursing or the ambulance service. It covers a wide variety of health modules from communication in health and social care, to anatomy and physiology.

Types of careers

Care Management

As a care assistant you will help clients with personal care tasks, such as washing, dressing and eating to help them in their day to day lives.

Social Work

Social workers provide advice, support and resources to individuals and families to help them solve their problems.

Nursing

Nursing jobs involve treating patients who are sick and injured and also offering advice and emotional support to patients and their families.

Construction

Studying construction help you take your first steps towards a career in the construction industry. You'll learn essential skills from bricklaying, carpentry and joinery to plumbing, painting and decorating.

Types of careers

Builder

Builders oversee, coordinate and work on the construction, repair and renovation of homes and other buildings. They may also manage entire projects.

Plumber

Plumbers main role is to design and build layouts for pipes, drainage systems and other plumbing materials.

Electrician

Electricians solve electrical issues using appropriate testing devices and repair and replace equipment or wiring.

Digital Media/Multimedia

This course helps you to build your media knowledge through practical work and projects in preparation both for work and further study. The course lets you study a range of media such as video, radio and print and learn skills in audio computer and animation technology on the Digital Media Pathway. You will learn a range of skills that will help you to undertake research projects, organise productions and work in a production team.

Types of careers

Video Editor

Video editors are responsible for editing and assembling video into a product ready for broadcasting, this may include dialogue, sound effects, graphics and special effects.

Blogger

Bloggers write, edit, post and promote the content on their web pages or websites, normally for brand partnerships or paid work.

Producer

A film producer is a person who oversees film production. They select the script, coordinate writing, directing, editing and arrange financing.

Engineering

The Engineering BTEC includes maths, physics and science. There are so many units to choose from so students can bring her own personality into their learning. Engineering can take you into multiple creative industries, such as product design, aerospace, manufacturing, electronics, electrical engineering or the automotive industry as a project leader or designer.

Types of careers

Aerospace Engineering

Aerospace engineers design aircrafts and study the aerodynamic performance of aircraft and construction materials.

Chemical Engineer

Chemical engineers are involved in the research and development of chemical processes required to produce products such as food, drinks and cleaning products.

Mechanical Engineer

Mechanical engineers design power producing machines such as electric generators, internal combustion engines and steam and gas turbines.

Hair & Beauty

Studying beauty is perfect for anyone aspiring to be in the beauty industry, or that has a passion for beauty therapy. You will learn a wide variety of skills such as client care and communication, workplace practices and procedures, body massage, self-tanning, make-up for performers, nail enhancements and reflexology.

Types of careers

Beautician

A beautician carries out a variety of beauty related jobs such as manicures, pedicures, waxing and facials.

Makeup Artist

Makeup artists offer general makeup services or work in prosthetic design. This includes enhancing facial aesthetics through makeup, creating custom looks for clients and working with actors on movie sets.

Masseuse

As a masseuse you will massage muscles and soft tissues of the body to provide treatment for medical conditions, injuries or wellness maintenance.

Hairdressing

Hairdressing is a fast moving, fashion orientated business, so you will need to be creative, enjoy meeting people, have loads of energy and be a good communicator.

You may start by assisting in the day to day running of a salon, learn and practise hairdressing techniques and treatments and understand the knowledge behind this.

Barbering

Barbering has a unique position within the hair and beauty sector, as it combines traditional skills, such as scissors over comb and shaving, with new specialist techniques, such as 2D and 3D sculpting.

Hospitality

Hospitality can help you take your first steps towards a career in events, catering or accommodation. You'll learn essential skills such as planning and running an event, preparing and serving food and drink and delivering first-class customer service.

Types of careers

Concierge

Concierge staff help arrange or give advice on transportation, business services or entertainment, or monitor guest requests for housekeeping and maintenance.

Events Planning

Events planning involves organising event facilities and details such as decor, catering, entertainment, transportation, location, invitee list, special guests, equipment and promotional material.

Hotel Manager

A hotel manager oversees all operations and day-to-day activities in a hotel. They take on a variety of duties including accounting, sales, business development and customer service.



ICT and Computing

Information communications technology (ICT) involves studying technology that uses telecommunication to store, transmit or access digital information. It focuses on the way that modern technology affects our society and how we communicate. If you go down the computing path, you will gain an insight into programming and computer theory which is useful for a wide variety of careers.

Types of careers

App Developer

App developers create new apps for businesses/games and work on the graphics and design of them.

Graphics Designer

Graphics designers develop the overall layout and production design for advertisements, brochures, magazines and corporate reports.

ICT Security

ICT security employees monitor computer networks for security issues and investigate security breaches and other cyber security incidents.



Performing Arts

Studying performing arts is designed to be the first steps in developing as an actor support progression to higher education. It is an exciting vocational course that engages the learners on assignment projects that culminate in practical performances. You will have the chance to investigate the work of performing arts practitioners and explore technical performance skills and creative skills.

Types of careers

Drama Teacher

Being a drama teacher involves creating lesson plans, teaching the history of drama and assisting students in creating their own dramatic pieces.

Actor/Actress

Actors express ideas and portray characters in theatre, film, television and other performing arts media. They also work at theme parks or other live events.

Set Designer

A set designer is in charge of designing and creating the sets that appear in films and television programmes as well as in the theatre.

Studying music gives you the opportunity to learn about performance in both ensemble and solo settings, general musicianship as well as researching and investigating professional practice in the pop music industry and the range of opportunities for solo performance. You will learn how to respond to a set performance briefs alongside developing your knowledge of the musical language.

Types of careers

Song Writer

Songwriters often specialize in writing and composing music for one specific instrument or part of a song.

Music Producer

Music producers oversee all aspects of a recording session, from planning the sessions to the finished product.

Sports

Sports BTEC enables students to develop their knowledge in the different areas of sport in both a theoretical and practical way. You can study a range of topics from anatomy and physiology to health and nutrition and it is a great subject to study if you would like a career in the sporting world, whether that be as an athlete or at management level.

Types of careers

Sports Presenter

The role of a presenter is to present up to date information to viewers/listeners. This involves interviewing guests and preparing content.

Nutritionist

Nutritionists assess patients' and clients' health needs and diet and help patients with nutrition issues and healthy eating habits.

Physiotherapist

Physiotherapists help people recover with injuries sustained from surgery, illness, ageing or disability by creating a treatment plan of exercises and therapy.

Science

For anyone who sees their future career in science, applied science is an excellent starting point. It covers a wide range of topics across biology, chemistry and physics and will allow you to learn a high level of practical laboratory skills. The course suits anyone, whether you love laboratory work, enjoy learning facts about the human body, watching chemical reactions or the agri-food industry.

Types of careers

Chemist

A chemist searches for new knowledge about chemicals and uses it to improve the way we live. This could include new medicines or new scientific technologies.

Archaeologist

Archaeologists study past human activity by excavating, dating and interpreting objects and sites of historical interest.

Forensic Scientist

Forensic scientists use scientific techniques to look at evidence from crimes and prepare legal statements used in court cases.

Apprenticeships & Supported Internships

Apprenticeships are an exciting option - you get hands-on training and the chance to put your skills into practice.

An apprenticeship is a real job where you learn, gain experience and get paid. You're an employee with a contract of employment and holiday leave.

Supported Internships provide on-site practical work training, for young adults with special educational needs to gain work skills, leading to competitive paid employment.

Apprenticeships

A real job, with hands-on experience, a salary and the chance to train while you work. You're treated just like all the other employees, with a contract of employment and holiday leave. If you're 16 or over, you can become an apprentice as long as you spend at least 50% of your working hours in England for the duration of the apprenticeship and you are not in full-time education.

When you are an apprentice...

- you get paid and train at the same time, with at least 20% of your time spent in off the job training, often at a college, university or with a training provider
- you train to be fully competent in your chosen occupation

Your apprenticeship can take between one and six years to complete, depending on which apprenticeship you choose, what level it's at and your previous experience.

Different apprenticeships are available all over England, at companies large and small, in a wide range of industries and organisations – from local organisations to large national brands. You get valuable hands-on experience working whilst you learn, which helps you progress in your working life.

The classroom based learning at the workplace enables young people to try out different work roles, supported by a job coach.

Option 1: Supported Internship

A Supported Internship is an employer-based learning programme. The aim is to support SEND young people aged 16-24 with an Education, Health and Care plan who want to find work to develop the skills, knowledge and experience to progress into employment.

To access the programme, you must want to find work at the end of the programme, be able to complete 400+ hours of work experience and be age 16-24 and have an EHCP.

A supported internship is a transition to work programme where young people with an EHC Plan can learn about the workplace by being in work. Interns are based at The Whittington Hospital five days a week for an academic year (Sept – July). The site is staffed by a qualified teacher and job coaches to meet educational and training needs. Through a series of three targeted internships, interns acquire competitive, marketable, and transferable skills to enable them to move into paid employment.

Candidates must meet the following criteria in order to be eligible to apply for an internship:

- aged 16-25 years old with an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan
- be an autistic young person or have a related learning difficulty
- have an interest to move into employment
- be an independent traveller or working towards

NHS England provides supported internships for learners who have an Education Health & Care Plan, through a programme service-provider called 'Choices College'.

Choices College is a Specialist Post-16 College that delivers an OFSTED and Education Skills Funding Agency approved curriculum, that links into additional NCFE accredited provision. All educational-based delivery is embedded into a learner's work-place training and learning.

We have over 200 learners across several local authorities, in the UK and our staff work closely with over 14 National Health Service (NHS) trusts. Choices College provides learners with the opportunity to complete up to three work-role rotations, most of which are in hospitals but some placements have occurred in private or public-sector settings.

Choices College also make provision for enhancing a learner's literacy and numeracy skills. English and mathematics skills are embedded within our supported internship programme; and accreditation can arrange if and where applicable.

Entry Requirement

Entry requirements for this programme are that students are aged 16-24, have a learning disability and an Education, Health and Care Plan in place, who also:

- would like to find a job
- will be ready for work after completing the programme
- will be able to travel independently by the end of the programme

Programme

The internship programme is a full-time study programme that runs throughout the academic year (September to July)

- Interns will be offered up to three placements, lasting 10-12 weeks each
- Four days per week are spent in the work place, with one day in the classroom.
- Interns are supported by a Workplace Mentor, Project Coordinator and an Area Manager. Students may benefit from the support of a Job Coach, in the work place, on a daily basis should they require one.
- In the classroom, Interns learn about employment and develop employability skills, as well as having study time to improve Maths and English.

Choices College

Post Internship

Interns are supported after their internship ends. Sustaining employment is key to us and we are committed to helping Interns to achieve this objective in addition to their additional goals.

This support includes:

- Pastoral support
- Professional support in meetings, e.g. appraisals, occupational health, etc.
- Coaching preparation for progression interviews
- Offering two-way support through Project Ambassadors and Mentors for new Interns.

Examples of WORK placements offered include:

- **Administration** – Scanning documents, admin duties, emails, filing, telephone work and typing documents when needed
- **Library Support** - Book stacking, scanning in and out of books
- **Goods In Porter** - Meeting the public, taking receipt of goods, despatching of goods, signing and checking deliveries, updating information on to in-house system. Pack deliveries to be picked up
- **Postroom Porter** - Emptying post bag, sorting post into pigeon holes, delivering and collecting post. Franking and dispatching mail
- **Reception** - Meet and greet public, taking deliveries, answering phones, meeting room management, photocopiers, setting up meeting rooms and keeping tidy, receiving and sorting internal post, dispatching internal post
- **Payroll Admin Support** - photocopying, computer work, saving documents, sorting post for department, taking messages
- **Tradesman Junior** - Assist Supervisor/Fitter on commercial equipment throughout the Trust. Working alongside the maintenance team
- **Finance Administrator** - Computer data entry, working with excel, sending emails, filing, photocopying, collecting and distributing post.
- **Catering** – Assist with picking and packing of hospital meals. Assist with the delivery of meals to patients and colleagues in both public & private care.
